Gospel - Luke 20:27-38

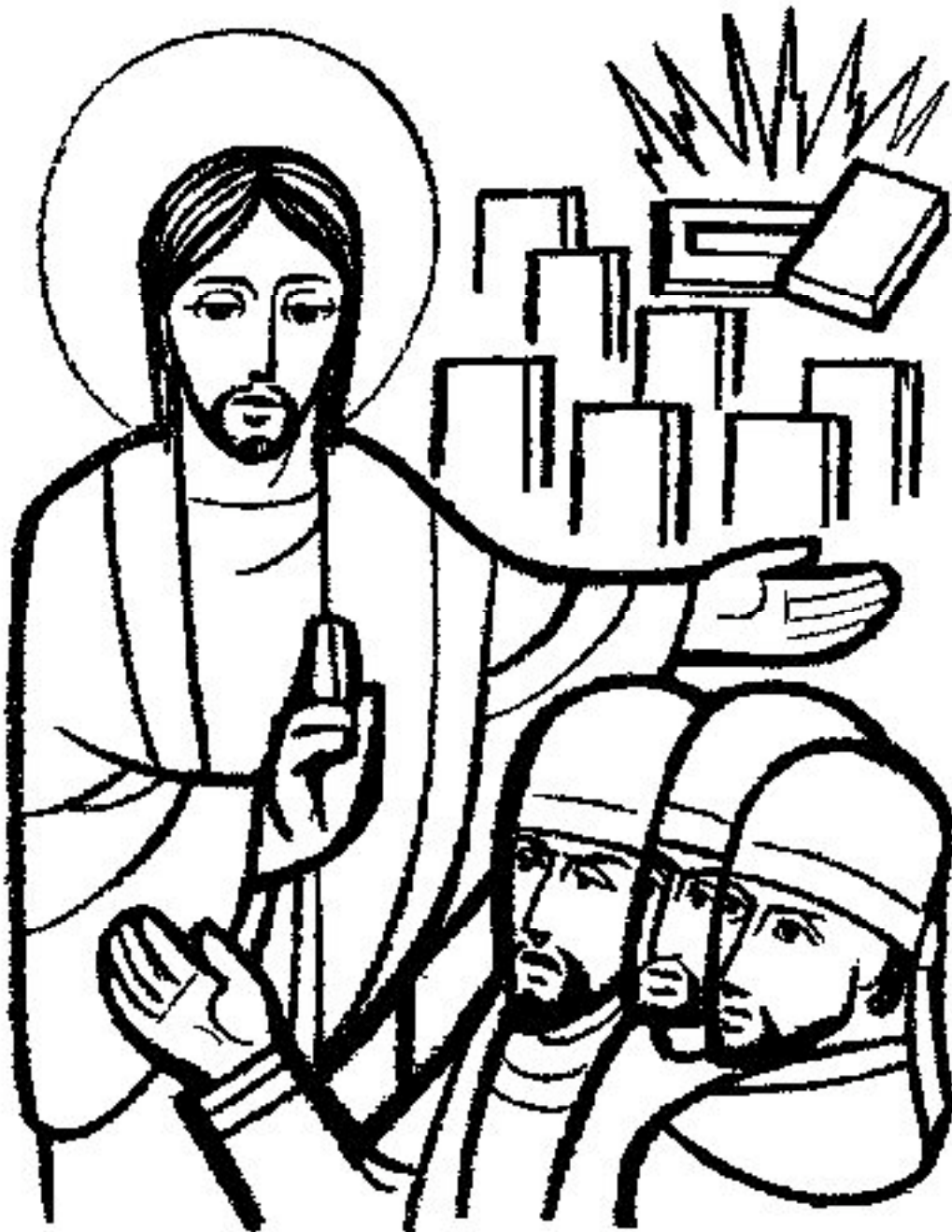
